## 6 Tips for Transitioning to a Paperless Dental Office

### Evaluate your existing processes

Think about how you currently handle making appointments, submitting insurance claims, creating treatment plans, and tracking inventory. If you're still using paper for any of these processes, see if your dental software can handle these tasks. If it can, contact your provider to arrange training. If it can't, consider switching to software that has the capabilities you're looking for.

### Be realistic about your timeline

Going paperless is not an overnight event. Take it one step at a time so you don't overwhelm yourself or your staff. Set a realistic timeline that will allow everyone to adjust to the new processes and learn the new technology. Transitioning to a paperless dental office can take anywhere from six months to two years depending on which processes you're already doing digitally.

### Start with practice management software

Often, the hardest part about starting a big project – like switching to a paperless dental office – is knowing where to start. If your existing practice management software isn't upgrading should be your first step. Consider every component of management software that has a digital alternative.



Don't throw away your paper charts – yet

Once you convert your paper records into a digital format, it might be tempting to empty your file cabinets into the dumpster. Not only does this put your patients' privacy at risk, you might want to reference those paper charts as your team adjusts to the new changes. Over time, you'll find yourself looking at the paper charts less and less until you stop completely.

Small changes can make a big impact

There's a time and place for big investments, like new computers and intraoral cameras, but small changes can have a big impact, too. For example, an electronic signature pad, which starts at less than \$200, can be used to digitally add a patient's signature to forms and receipts. This would save your front office staff the time of printing a document, having a patient sign it, and then scanning and saving the form.
